ACADEMIC PROFILE

National University is an independent, not-for-profit institution which provides higher education for working adults. Programs offered include the following degrees: AA, AS, BA, BS, BSL, BBA, BPA, BTE, MA, MS, MBA, MPA, JD. The State of California Commission on Teaching Credentialing has approved the teacher credential programs. The University is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges, the agency responsible for granting national accreditation to colleges and universities in the western United States. The School of Law is accredited by the Committee of Bar Examiners of the State Bar of California.

ACADEMIC CALENDAR

The University is on the quarter system. The academic schedule provides for attendance in one course every four weeks. The academic year is divided into four equal twelve week quarters. It is possible to complete twelve courses within a twelve month period. A five quarter unit undergraduate course requires 48 hours of classroom instruction; a five unit graduate course requires 40 hours of classroom instruction. Most courses carry five quarter units of credit. Some law school courses are offered over an 11 week period.

ADVANCED STANDING

Undergraduate credit may be allowed for course work completed while in the military service (following recommendations listed in the American Council on Education "Guide to the Evaluation of Educational Experiences in the Armed Services"), by examination (e.g., CLEP or departmental examination), the assessment of experiential learning (prior to 1987), for certain noncollegiate courses listed in the American Council on Education "National Guide to Educational Credit for Training Programs" or the University of the State of New York "Directory of the National Program on Noncollegiate Sponsored Instruction" or evaluated by the University, and as determined by the Board of Evaluators of Technical Education (BTE degree only). Credit is awarded on a course equivalency basis. The following suffix information designates the source of credit for specific courses listed in the Advanced Standing section:
